Not So Delighted

Some residents in Carnock resorted to bringing out the 'big guns' over lighting and power problems recently. The first problem was the loss of some of the street lighting in Main Street. Despite informing Fife Council about the problem, no action seemed forthcoming. Residents asked Councillor William Walker for help in resolving this issue. Others contacted Jim Tolson, MSP and Tom Docherty, MP. Finally, a member of Fife council explained:

'There are currently 25 similar faults within West Fife, all with residents who wish their street to be the highest priority. Problems with Scottish Power have been ongoing for many years for authorities throughout Scotland and representations have been made to the Government's regulatory body to seek a resolution. The reason that the lights are burning 24 hours is because SP have made a temporary repair to provide lights. It is either the lights burn all the time or there are no lights at all. I would suggest that the

residents would prefer the lights to be burning 24 hours until a permanent repair is made.'

We are all hoping that the increased pressure on the authorities will bring about a speedy solution.

Meanwhile, a second Scottish Power problem exists for some. There are approximately 1,500 residences served by the low-power network at Craigluscar who are experiencing short-term transient loss of power. These include some premises to the west of Carnock. These power losses last for a few seconds up to around 10 seconds. Originally the problem was thought to be cows rubbing on a faulty pole stay. Then we were told it was buzzards shorting the lines – there were a number of dead birds found under the power lines. However, despite various attempts to remedy the problems, power cuts continue. These are also affecting the 11 kV high power line. The search for a solution continues. Meantime, if you have a problem, always report it. This will help Scottish Power determine the extent and nature of the fault. Their fault/emergency number is: 0845 27 27 999.

Carnock and Gowkhall Community Council News

Pedestrian Lights – Carnock Bridge

After pressure from C&GCC A907 Safety Group, Carnock Primary School Headteacher and CPS Parent-Teacher, Fife Council Traffic Management took another look at these lights to see if improvements were possible to help reduce the near-miss incidents for pedestrians crossing the road.

To help avoid the ambiguity of the multiple light heads visible to vehicle drivers – Fife Council have modified aspects of the operation of these lights over the past few months. They have removed a couple of the green lamps that were visible when other lamps showed red. They

have also turned the ‘blinkers’ to reduce the visibility of the remaining green lamps.

Residents using the crossing will continue to monitor closely whether this improves their safety and fewer drivers going through on red. This is especially important now that the children are back at school.

If you witness any incidents, please report them to one of the community police officers at Oakley, giving as much detail as possible.

C&GCC continue to support other residents in lobbying Fife Council to move the pedestrian lights to the bridge buildout.

PLANNING NOTES

A couple of proposed developments locally have resulted in some debate amongst residents. C&GCC have discussed these at their recent meetings.

School House, Main Street, Carnock

A number of residents have expressed concern that the owners are seeking permission to form a new access on to the A907 here, in close proximity to the traffic lights.

They consider that this will add to the hazards at these lights (already a topic of concern raised with Fife Council). However, it appears FC Transportation do not accept this apprehension. C&GCC submitted an objection and the issue of approval is still under consideration (see <http://planning.fife.gov.uk>). If you have any views on this, talk with FC Planning: Angus Dodds quoting Planning reference: 10/02271/ARC.

Jaws, Paws, and Claws

This thriving, useful local business at Glendale Carnock Road, slightly outside our immediate area near to Lundin Road, but close enough to interest local residents, seems to be causing FC planners some concern.

The owner has applied for retrospective permission to complete the work they had already started. However, FC Transportation are making an issue of ‘an increase in turning manoeuvres at a junction with the sub-standard visibility splays to the detriment of road safety’. It would seem that this view is not shared with most members of our community, a number of whom are customers and find the local shop a convenience. BRANCHING OUT!

A number of residents have approached C&GCC asking if they can ask Fife Council to cut the grass and hedges. Consequently, C&GCC took up this issue with Ian Jones, Lead Officer, Roads Management (South Fife) in Transportation Services at the Milesmark depot.

Poor Visibility a Road Danger

Firstly, the contractors responsible for the once-per-year cutting of grass verges were very much behind schedule this year. This meant that some of the road junctions had reduced visibility for drivers. Now that they have cut the verges, things have improved. If you continue to experience problem areas, let Fife Council know. Ian Jones tells us that FC are responsible for cutting the first two metres back from the road edge: after that, it is the responsibility of the adjacent land owner. But how many land owners know or care about that, we wonder?

Who Cuts the Hedges?

Most of the hedges are the responsibility of the land owner. However, as a one-off task this summer, Fife Council did cut back the beeches alongside Carnock Road at Queens Haugh. The original hedging was never cut. The beeches had grown into small trees and were overhanging the A907, interfering with cars and buses. The hedging lies outside the boundary of adja-

cent gardens, so the owners there feel no responsibility for them. Possibly the original developer had some obligation but some of those businesses no longer exist. So who has the ongoing responsibility now?

C&GCC and Fife Council are discussing this issue. Ian Jones did make an inspection of Carnock Road, between Carnock and Gowkhall recently, since pedestrians were having to walk in the road to avoid the sharp hawthorn and rose hedging there. Some of the hedges alongside Gowkhall were of concern, too. We will let you know how things might improve in the near future and years ahead.

Please Cut Back Your Hedge

This is the request from the many pedestrians walking our footpaths and pavements. It particularly concerns those with children who walk along Main Street, Carnock. By the end of the summer, pedestrians walking around overgrown, overhanging hedges are forced dangerously close to the traffic.

All currently serving Community Councillors retire at midnight 13 October 2010 - with the exception of the Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. They continue in office until, but not including the inaugural meeting of the 2010-13 session.

Candidates may optionally provide a short statement in support of their candidature. A form for this, which the candidate MUST sign, accompanies the nomination paper. Your statement should not exceed 50 words: Fife Council will circulate it with the ballot paper in the event of a poll. Candidates should return the signed statement with the nomination paper by no later than Thursday 16th September 2010.

Fife Council will hold a postal ballot on Thursday 14th October 2010 if the number of nominations for our area exceeds 10, the number of vacancies permitted for our Community Council.

The inaugural meeting of the Community Council 2010-13 session will be at 8pm Tue 19 October 2010, whether an election is required or not. This follows the C&GCC AGM, which starts at 7pm.
